5. Reports

- a) Chair's and vice chair's actionsNo actions were reported.
- b) Sub-Committee reports
- i) Christian Distinctiveness meeting The minutes of the meeting on 19th June 2025 had been circulated. The report dealt with:
 - Action plan which included Global citizenship,
 - Spirituality,
 - Reaching out to the community,
 - Celebrate links with St Luke's,
 - Teaching of RE,
 - Worship and Prayer Ambassadors
 - CD Advisor
 - RE

Actions from the meeting are in hand.

Resolved: Governors accepted and adopted the Christian Distinctiveness report and approved the decisions made.

- ii) Finance The minutes of the Finance committee meeting on 20th March 2025 were available to governors and dealt with:
 - 2024-25 budget lines Governors had commended GC on the way the budget was managed and asked the reasons for the surplus.
 - New budget 25/26 Governors had clarified funding of pay awards, asked for promotion of the nursery and were concerned about low number affecting its viability, clarified staffing of catering and asked about future income trends and use of deprivation and support funding.

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 Maternity cover and staffing – Governors had thanked HM for the advance preparation she had done and asked how her additional responsibilities would be covered.

Resolved: Governors confirmed their approval of the budget for 2025/26 as recommended by the Finance committee.

iii) Education – The minutes of the Education Committee meeting of 26th June 2025 had been circulated.

The meeting dealt with:

- School improvement plan Governors had asked about feedback from the Safeguarding audit and commended the school on the way it had incorporated careers and the professional development of staff.
- Staffing Governors had asked about numbers for nursery and reception for September 2025.
- Headteacher's report Governors had noted the improved attendance, asked about the revision of the Pupil Premium statement and advised about reducing costs of using the pool in future.
- Wellbeing Governors had complimented the school on its wellbeing strategy.
- Quality of education.

Resolved: Governors accepted and adopted the Education Committee report and approved of the decisions made.

iv) Nominated link governor reports.

Governors thanked GC/AB for the comprehensive report on SEND and acknowledged the complaints, concerns, and developments.

GC explained that staff have been asked to make contact with their link governor. Link governors will be invited to the November staff meeting to discuss each subject with the subject leaders. GC has a template for use by link governors to record their observations and discussions which will then be available to all governors.

6. Headteacher's report – Previously circulated.

The headteacher's report had been circulated and governors had been invited to submit questions. It dealt with:

- School context
- Ofsted July 2023 The actions are fully embedded. Governors asked if there had been any formal evaluation. GC stated that an evaluation by the SIP will occur in the Autumn term.
- SEND See comprehensive report in item 5 b iv.
- Attendance

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- Use of Pupil Premium and Sports Premium See statement with this agenda.
- Effectiveness of leadership and management GC drew attention to the staffing and explained that nursery numbers are low because parents are choosing to keep their children in private nurseries as the children can attend over the holidays.
- The quality of teaching, learning and assessment GC referred governors to the data for EYFS, Phonics and Multiplication.
- Personal development, behaviour and welfare
- Outcomes for children and learners including 2025 assessment results
- Continuing Professional Development (CPD)
- Ethos and vision.

Governors asked about the Stone heads group. GC explained that Mrs Thorn, principal of Christ Church Academy does the agenda, and it meets regularly, and the discussion is now more focused. GC outlined changes in leadership in some of the first schools.

Governors suggested that governors should discuss the future of Tittensor First School in the near future.

GC was thanked for her report.

9. Staff wellbeing

SA explained that regular updates are given to staff in staff briefings. Resources to support wellbeing are signposted and GC deals sympathetically with wellbeing requests from staff. GC explained that staff work very hard, so the teaching and learning is excellent, so her consideration of wellbeing is a way of giving a little back to staff. Through the sickness insurance there is a wellbeing portal which is used by staff.

Governors commented that the report on children's wellbeing was brilliant. GC explained that Miss Keeling works well with those children who need a little extra support.

10 | Health and Safety

Governors had seen the Audit and GC has completed the action plan. GC and SW will revise the Business Continuity Plan in the Autumn term.

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Governors asked if the audit covers cyber security. GC explained that it does, and staff will have cyber security training in the Autumn term.
